Postural tachycardia syndrome (POTS) is a heterogeneous clinical syndrome characterized by sustained excessive postural tachycardia (≥ 30 bpm within 10 min of standing or $>60^\circ$ head-up tilt) in the absence of orthostatic hypotension and with chronic symptoms of orthostatic intolerance (Freeman et al., 2011).In patients
